
Soil Horizons

Next to each soil horizon put the letter that matches from the description below. Color the soil horizons.



- O This is the top layer, the "organic" layer which is made up of dead plant matter for the most part.
- A This is the second layer of soil, what we call the "top soil". It too has lots of organic matter mixed in and is usually darkly colored.
- **B** Subsoil layer. There isn't much organic stuff in here. Sometimes the transition between top soil and subsoil is very sharp and defined and sometimes they fade into one another.
- C This layer usually has lots of large rocks mixed in with soil deep underground.
- D This is the bedrock that lies beneath the soil. In some places this can be quite near the surface and in others it is very, very deep.
